- ❖ Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India runs several educational, health and livelihood related projects under various schemes for the welfare of Scheduled Tribes (STs) across the country through Voluntary Organizations (VOs) / Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs).
- ❖ The Ministry intends to respectively conduct independent concurrent monitoring and evaluation, of its various schemes run through Voluntary organizations (VOs)/ NGOs.
- ❖ The Ministry **has already short listed the nodal monitoring agency having nation-wide network for independent concurrent monitoring of projects during 2010-13.**
- ❖ The Ministry now proposes to choose another national level nodal **evaluation** agency for independent evaluation of projects during 2010-11 (mid-term) and at the end of the XIth Plan during 2012, after independent concurrent monitoring has been carried out in 2010-12.
- ❖ **Institutions/ organizations willing to undertake above evaluation studies are required to submit technical and financial bids separately for the studies.**
- ❖ The Terms of Reference and Bid Documents can be obtained from the Ministry from Mrs. Asha Pandey, Section Officer (Statistics) , Room No. 239, August Kranti Bhavan, Bhikaji Cama Place, New Delhi - 66 at the cost/ fee of Rs. 1000/- which is non-fundable, **or** can be downloaded from the website (link:

tribal.nic.in/index.asp) and submitted along with required cost. The payment should be in the form of Demand Draft/ Banker's Cheque/ Pay order, issued in favour of the PAO, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi, payable at Delhi. Tenders submitted without requisite fee would not be accepted.

- ❖ The last date for submission of the bids is 1600 hours, **16th July, 2010.**
- ❖ Bid evaluation criteria for selection of institution is given herein under for the guidance of intending bidders. Bidders have to get at least **70** marks in Technical evaluation for being considered for financial evaluation and may be required to give presentation. The bidder with lowest financial quote will be declared the successful bidder.
- ❖ Every bidder is required to furnish an earnest money deposit (EMD) of Rs. 5 lakhs by means of Demand Draft/ Banker's Cheque/ Pay order/ Bank Guarantee along with the unpriced part of the Bid. The EMD should be in favour of the PAO, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi, payable at Delhi. Tenders without EMD are liable to be rejected.

TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR)

Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India, runs several educational, health and livelihood related projects under following schemes for the welfare of Scheduled Tribes (STs) across the country through Voluntary Organizations (VOs)/ Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs):

2. All the above-mentioned schemes envisage independent evaluation of projects through a nationwide Nodal Independent Evaluation Agency (IEA).

3. The aim of this evaluation is to involve **independent, reputed** organisations of the country in bringing systemic improvements in the quality of services and the delivery mechanism at the ground level in order to ensure a visible and positive impact on socio-economic conditions of tribals.

4. The Ministry wishes to invite proposals from organisations for this assignment during 2010-11 and at the end of XIth Plan, i.e. during 2012, after independent concurrent monitoring has been carried out during 2010-12, to act as an independent “Nodal IEA”, preferably based at Delhi **that will coordinate midterm and final evaluation of projects either through its nationwide network or with zone wise reputed IEAs to be chosen by the nodal IEA in consultation with this Ministry.** For this task, the nodal IEA, if required, may select one or two competent and reputed

zonal IEAs from each zone (East, West, North or South) depending on the no. of projects funded in each zone).

5. The Nodal Agency will be selected through Financial Bids. For the Agencies, their infrastructure and facilities, networking/ linkages, financial status, proven track record in terms of achievements and recognition, key professionals and supporting staff, past experience, technical competency in research and training, and statistical & system development capabilities will be the main criteria of selection.

6. The proposed study is to be exhaustive so that all areas and aspects are brought out along with solutions. The scope of the study includes review of records and allocation & utilization of funds under the schemes, evaluation of the performance of the NGOs and schemes on the basis of targets set and the achievements according to the norms and to identify the problems, if any, in the selection of the beneficiaries under the schemes. In all, it is also to bring out the overall impact on the beneficiaries – both tangible and intangible.

7. The interested bidders are requested to extensively read the schemes and the tender document along with the scope of work and the deliverables / tasks.

8. **Objectives of the study**

- Analysis of physical and financial performance of the schemes.
- To ascertain whether the guidelines are being followed by different stake holders.
- To ascertain quantity, value, quality, utilization, development efficiency, effectiveness and survival of services rendered and assets created, if any, under the schemes.
- To understand the sustainability of the services rendered and assets created and its implication on success of activities chosen under the schemes.
- Impact assessment of the programmes & projects in terms of quality of operations, involvement of adjoining communities, perceptible improvement in human development indices of the tribals, incremental income generation and creation of employment opportunities and its role in poverty alleviation of tribal people.
- Assessment of role of skill enhancement and technology adoption in enhancing success of schemes undertaken.

9. **Methodology:**

A universal methodology is required to be adopted rather than a region specific methodology. However, special features of a state need to be captured. The study is to be carried out to assess the impact of the programmes in sample districts of all the

states in the country where the schemes are being implemented in such a way so that a representative sample comprising a minimum 25-30 % of each major scheme/ programme on education, health, vocational training, coaching centers, etc. is taken up yielding optimum precision in the estimates. Secondary data obtained from various records and reports have also to be used in the study. In addition, focus group discussions and qualitative observations of the field teams are to be made use of to supplement the data collected for in depth analysis.

10. Nodal Agency would perform following functions:

- ❖ Suggest further refinement, if necessary of the evaluation method and sampling and finalize them in consultation with the Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
- ❖ Develop the questionnaires, field test it and finalize it in consultation with the Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
- ❖ Coordinate with zonal IEAs to organize field survey/ data collection according to the projects/ schemes, including training of field workers and their supervision, data validation, compilation, data entry, analysis and report writing.
- ❖ Develop a sustainable web-based application system for data entry, data validation, compilation, analysis and report generation, etc.
- ❖ Coordinate and support the zonal IEAs to prepare 'State reports' by providing the Basic Framework / Chapterisation Plan and the basic tables.
- ❖ To cross/ back check the work done by zonal IEAs on random sampling basis.
- ❖ To prepare All India report at the end of each evaluation process.

11. Deliverables/ tasks

- NGOs and Projects will be evaluated by zonal IEAs on the basis of their performance and impact on tribals during 2010-11 and at the end of XIth Plan period in 2012 by sampling method. An illustrative list of zone wise States and districts where projects are located is annexed.
- The reports of zonal IEAs (State-wise) will be in a web friendly format (to be developed by Nodal IEA and zonal IEAs in consultation with each other).
- Nodal IEA should ensure uniformity in the web-based format for various zones/states.
- The zonal IEAs will have to submit a copy of their quality evaluation report to the Nodal IEA and to the Ministry and the Nodal IEA, in turn, will submit the country report to the Ministry. The nodal IEA will submit the Country and State specific reports in English and Hindi at the end of each evaluation process in 10 (ten) hard copies and soft copies in 2 (two) Pen drives.

12. Details of EMD to be provided:

- (a) Every bidder is required to furnish an earnest money deposit (EMD) of Rs. 5 lakhs by means of Demand Draft/ Banker's Cheque/ Pay order/ Bank Guarantee along with the unpriced part of the Bid. The EMD should be in favour of the PAO, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi, payable at Delhi.
- (b) Tenders without EMD are liable to be rejected.
- (c) EMD of the unsuccessful bidder shall be released after issuance of Letter of Acceptance (LOA)/ Work order against this tender. However, in case of successful bidder, the EMD shall be released on receipt of Performance Guarantee.

13. Specific Terms and Conditions

- (i) Nodal IEA will be responsible for the complete evaluation process in 2010-11 and at the end of XIth Plan in 2012.
- (ii) The Nodal IEA will ensure that the consolidated evaluation reports reach the Ministry by Dec 2010 and Dec 2012, respectively.
- (iii) Ministry will release payments in instalments to the Nodal IEA as follows:

The first two installments are proposed to be released in the third quarter of the financial year 2010-11 **against a bank guarantee of 10% of the total value of the project valid for 3 years from the date of award of the project and balance 60%** will be released in two installments only after receipt of the Evaluation reports as mentioned above. Nodal IEA, in turn, will disburse the funds to each zonal IEA, if involved, as per their requirement. If

the report is not submitted within the time stipulated in para 13 (ii), or if it is not of a reasonable quality, then **30%** of the total value of the project will be forfeited. Such a process will be continued for the next Evaluation process as well.

- (iv) The nodal agency must have skill base of large, expert manpower (permanent as well as temporarily hired) for conducting and coordinating data collection, filtering, system designing and development, and data analysis. After the appointment of the Nodal Agency, it will give an undertaking to make the proposed team of experts/ staff available for the study at their end.
 - (v) Keeping in view the capabilities of the selected agencies for monitoring and evaluation work, they may be required to conduct similar studies for schemes run by other subject matter divisions of the Ministry on demand on the same terms and conditions.
 - (vi) The interested IEA should develop the web based data entry software in consultation with the Ministry of Tribal Affairs and provide licensed copies of the software for the project. The cost of the licensed copies is to be included in the budget estimates for the project.
14. The selection of an IEA would depend on the evaluation of the technical bids followed by financial bids submitted.
 15. Any effort by Bidder or Bidder's agent, Consultant or Representative, howsoever described to influence the ministry in any way concerning scrutiny/ consideration/ evaluation / comparison of the bid or decision concerning the award of the contract shall entail the rejection of the bid.
 16. Ministry will not be responsible for any delay, loss or non- receipt of tender documents sent by post/ courier.
 17. Offers and other documents must be in English language only.
 18. The Ministry of Tribal Affairs would advise the State Governments and concerned VOs/ NGOs for rendering necessary assistance for undertaking the study and provide secondary data that are available, if required.
 19. The monitoring of progress of the evaluation project will be by the Statistics Division, Ministry of Tribal Affairs. The nodal and/ or zonal agencies should be available for discussion, etc. with the Ministry as and when required on short notice (either by phone, post, fax and e-mail).
 20. The Nodal Agency would enter into an agreement with the government and furnish a bond in Non-judicial Stamp Paper of Rs. 100/- and submit Pre-Receipt of the amount due for instalment (s). The Ministry reserves the right to terminate the Nodal Agency's contract at any point of time after assigning a reason and due notice providing opportunity to explain. In such eventuality, the agency shall

have to refund the amount released by the government together with interest at prevailing market rates.

21. In the event of any question, dispute or difference arising under or out of or in connection with the conditions mentioned in TORs and sanction letter, the same shall be referred for the Sole Arbitration of any person appointed by the Secretary to the Government of India in the Ministry of Tribal affairs.
22. In case the selected Institute/ Organisation declines to take up the study after a notice of award has been issued, it would be barred from applying for any study, evaluation or assistance of any kind from Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India for a period of 3 years from the date of award.
23. The data generated from the study would be the sole property of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs. However, the evaluator may be allowed to use the data specifically for research/ analysis with the prior permission of Ministry.
24. If the aforesaid terms and conditions are acceptable and if your organization desires to become a partner with the Ministry in the development process for tribals, the proposal in this regard be submitted to the Ministry latest by **16th July 2010**. The proposal should invariably include methodology, implementation process, time lines, and financial projections for the complete job.
25. Short listed proposers will be asked to explain their methodology and their plan before a Committee of this Ministry to be appointed by the Secretary to the Government of India in the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, prior to the opening of their financial bids.

DRAFT FORMAT OF THE BOND

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS THAT , Wean agency registered under (Act under which the agency is registered) and having its office at in the State of(hereinafter called sureties jointly and severally bond) and our respective heirs executors administrators legal the obliger hereinafter called representatives and assignees by these presents, are held and firmly bound to the President of India (hereinafter called the Government) a sum of Rs.together with all other sums (including interests thereon) due and payable to the Government.

And whereas the obliger is an implementing Agency for the programme/project of tribal affairs as approved by the Government and described in the letter No. of the Government, subject to the Terms and conditions contained therein (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Sanction Letter")

And whereas the Government, for the due implementation of the said approved programme/ project, has agreed to extend to the obliger as such implementing Agency as aforesaid financial assistance by way of fee of the order of Rs. out of which of Rs have already been said to the obliger (the receipt where of the obliger does hereby admit and acknowledge) upon the obliger irrevocably promising to and assuring the Government that the said Sum of Rs. shall be utilized solely and exclusively for the purpose of implementation for the said approved programme/ project and for no other purpose in strict compliance of the stipulations and reservations contained in the sanction letter including executions of the Bond by the obliger and sureties which/who shall always remain bound to the Government for due fulfillment of the terms and conditions in the sanction letter. Now condition of the above written obligation is such that if the obliger shall duly implement the said approved programme in compliance of all the conditions, stipulations and reservations in the sanction letter, then the above written Bond obligation shall be void and of no effect but otherwise it shall remain fully enforceable, effective and operative against the obliger and the sureties and their respective assignees by these presents, against each of them.

These presents further witness that

- (a) The decision of the Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Tribal Affairs or the Administrative Head of the Ministry or Department of the Government of India administratively concerned with the matter of the questions whether there has been breach or violation on the part of the obliger of any of the terms and conditions mentioned in the letter of sanction shall be final and binding on the obliger.
- (b) The Obliger shall in the event of breach or violation of any of terms and conditions mentioned in the letter of sanction refund to the Government of its own or on demand and without demur the entire amount of or such part thereof as the Government alongwith the borrowing rate of interest of Government of India (interest therein at the rate of 12% (Twelve percent) per annum) from the date of receipt of said

amount by the obliger up to the date of refund thereof to the Government failing which the impugned amount would be recoverable as arrears of land revenue.

- (c) The obliger or the Sureties shall, in the event of breach or violation of any of the terms and conditions contained in the letter of sanction, refund to the Government on demand and without demur the entire amount of Rs. of such part thereof as may be mentioned in the notice of demand issued by the Government alongwith the interest thereon at the prevailing borrowing rate of the Government of India from the date of receipt of the said amount by the obliger/sureties till the date of payment therefore is received by the Government.
- (d) Without prejudice to (c) above, the Government shall have the right, without any demur on the part of the obliger or the Sureties, to revoke the said financial grant wholly or partially and/ or to take over such assets or to call upon and complete the obliger to transfer all such assets to a State Government, Panchayati Raj Institution or any other institutions/ associations, if the obliger commits any breach of the conditions and stipulations contained in the sanction letter.
